There is a term that is being dropped with more frequency called Point to Point. Loosely, it is the transmission of data from one location to another. More precisely in our industry, it is the movement of a live video signal at one end, to a remote location at the other end or what might be called a *Live Stream*. Typically, you will have an Encoder at the sending end; and a Decoder at the receiving end.

The Encoder prepares and creates a digital representation of the video signal to be sent over a hard-wired system such as fiber optics, or over a dedicated IP network, or even the Internet. The Decoder receives that digital signal and then puts it back into its original video configuration for display or re-broadcast.

This year, you will find more and more manufacturers in our industry offering a multitude of encoders and decoders. These may be offered in a form of software or external hardware units that will vary in price from a few hundred dollars to several thousand dollars on each end. The gear that is right for you will depend upon your exact requirements e.g. Standard Definition; High Definition; or both; and your budget.

In addition to a Point to Point (P2P) solution; you might need your single video feed to be sent to more than one location (Point to Multi-Point). Of course, bandwidth concerns are always a consideration as to how many remote locations you are trying to send your video to simultaneously and how much bandwidth that will require. This is where you will need to determine if the amount of bandwidth you have available will support and maintain a constant minimum bandwidth at all times during any of your transmissions.

I have included here a web site provided by csgnetwork.com for your ease of estimating bandwidth based upon the Horizontal and Vertical Resolutions plus refresh rates of your video to give you an idea of standard definition and high definition signal transmission bandwidth requirements *per second*.

(Also note that there are hidden bandwidth requirements such as IP Headroom and others that will increase your requirements.) http://www.csgnetwork.com/videosignalcalc.html

There are numerous manufacturers and service providers that can "Host" your bandwidth requirements so that: You send only one single stream (P2P) from your head-end encoder to that hosting service provider. That way, they will monitor, support and resend your video to the total number of locations required.

When considering these options, please keep in mind:

- 1. Your IT department may tell you that you are on a large fast pipe (Lots of Bandwidth); however, these applications require sustained minimal amounts to make certain of a clean and continuous stream of live video.
- 2. There are those that were certain they had plenty of bandwidth only to find out later that it was not a sustained minimal amount... or that as they were streaming live videos they were also slowing or bogging down the entire network, adversely affecting work flow speeds for everyone and everything that their network touched especially during normal business hours.

Encoding and decoding will allow live video to be sent or received from or to a remote location. Examples might include a House of Worship that wants to send its sermons, teachings, training, etc. to a remote satellite church or mission. Or a City Hall or educational facility that doesn't have a hard-wired video feed back to the head-end. This technology could allow transmitting a live video back to the studio for recording or immediate playback on your channel.

This technology will open up many opportunities for you to send and/or receive live video from remote locations that were previously not economically or physically available to you and your audience.
